Know all Men by these Bresents. That we Gerard P. O'Leary, Jr., Ph.D.,

all of lawful age, hereby agree to and with each other:
First. To associate ourselves together with the intention of forming a corporation
under and by virtue of the powers conferred by Chapter 7-6 of the General Laws of
Rhode Island, as amended.
SECOND. Said corporation shall be known by the name of
Eastern Colleges Science Conference
THIRD. Said corporation is constituted for the purpose of stimulating
undergraduate interest in the Natural Sciences and their relation
to other fields. Towards this end membership in Eastern Colleges
Science Conference is open to all colleges and peoples interested
in the organization's purpose. In support of its purpose the con-
ference runs at least one yearly conference sponsored by a host in-
stitution. The theme and program of the conference shall be left to the discretion of the host institution, the only stipulation being that there be ample opportunity for the presentation and discussion of papers representing the original work of undergraduates in the natural sciences and their relation to other fields.
In addition to the foregoing, said corporation shall have the following powers and authority, viz:—(See §§ 7-6-7, 7-6-8 of the General Laws.) To do any lawful set which is necessary or proper to accomplish the purposes of its incorporation. Without limiting or

⁽a) to have perpetual succession in its corporate name unless a period for its duration is limited in its articles of association or charter;

(e) to make by-laws not inconsistent with the Constitution or laws of the United States or of this state, or with the corporation's charter or articles of association, determining the time and place of holding and the manner of calling and of conducting mertings of its members and directors, the manner of electing its officers and directors, the mode of voting by prory, and the number, qualifications, powers, duties and term of office of its officers and directors, and containing any other provisions, whether of the same or of a different nature, for the management of the corporation's property and the regulation and government of its affairs:

⁽f) to make contracts, incur liabilities and borrow money.

Said corporation shall be entitled to take, hold, transmit and convey real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding in all one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000); provided, however, that the foregoing limitation shall not apply to corporations organized for the purposes of fostering, encouraging and assisting the physical location, settlement or resettlement of industrial and manufacturing enterprises within the state, and to whose members no profit shall centre. If any corporation subject to the foregoing limitation desires to take and bold property to an amount exceeding one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) either originally or by amendment, such privilege shall be granted only by the general assembly on petition thereto

FOURTH. | Said corporation shall be located in Providence , Rhode Island. (Gity or Town) (Further provisions not inconsistent with law) FIFTH No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributed to, its members, directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions.... in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article Third hereof. No substantial part of the activities shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in or otherwise intervene... in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. ____Notwithstanding any other provisions of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Lawl...... SIXTH Upon the dissolution of the corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of all of the assets of the corporation exclusively for the purposes of the corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable and educational purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States... Internal Revenue Law), as the Board of Directors shall determine.

Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Court having sufficient jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located. SEVENTH
